# Important changes to 128 timetables

East Yorkshire Buses have just told us that from 5th September, 128 Saturday services between Scarborough and Helmsley are almost halved. The bus company gave just over 2 weeks notice so for the rest of the Moorsbus operational period (i.e. until the end of September) please **ignore the 128 timetables** on page 13 of our timetable. There are also changes to the Sunday 128 services.

**Saturday** 128 departures from Helmsley are now: **0805**; **0940**; **1145**; **1345**; **1550**; **1755**; **1955** 

Unfortunately these departures will no longer serve Wombleton, Sinnington, Wrelton, Ebberston, Hutton Buscel, Seamer or Crossgates. To get to these villages from Helmsley you'll now have to wait for an hour at Kirkbymoorside or Pickering and change. Or walk.

East Yorkshire 128 **Sunday** services also have minor amendments moving some services forwards or backwards by 5 minutes or so. They won't go to Wombleton. **Please** pick up a 128 timetable—we are trying to ensure we are able to put them in our in-bus info box.

Users of the 128 will find that Monday to Friday services are also drastically reduced, and remember that from the end of October, there are **no** Sunday buses at all west of Pickering (i.e. nothing in Helmsley or Kirkbymoorside.)

We are sorry for all the inconvenience this will cause, which was completely outside our control.

You can rest assured that your volunteer directors at Moorsbus continue to battle tirelessly to protect car-free access throughout the area, working to improve services for its communities and its visitors.

# NYMA – Friends of the North York Moors

This season of staycations has seen an influx of visitors to the most scenic spots in Britain, including the North York Moors. One of the organisations that helps keep the National Park beautiful and accessible to all is the North Yorkshire Moors Association – NYMA for short.

Founded in 1985, NYMA is a charity run by volunteers who put their energy into safeguarding the natural and cultural history of the Moors and helping as many people as possible to enjoy it.

For many years, funding for Moorsbus has come partly from NYMA, and the group extends its reach right across the area with a year-round programme of Conservation Awards.

Recent grants have gone to the Esk Valley Camphill Community for habitat diversification in Danby Dale, paid for non-slip strips used by volunteer rangers to repair stiles and make them safe even for less agile walkers, and supported apple-pressing workshops which use traditional apple varieties.

As a membership organisation, NYMA runs monthly walks and other events and produces a quarterly magazine for its members. 'Voice of the Moors' is crammed full of articles and photos on the wildlife, history, economy, and personalities of the National Park. It's a great read!

In mid-October NYMA is hosting the National Park Societies' annual conference, where the future role of national parks will be highlighted and discussed. It'll be an inspiring and thought-provoking event, with both local and national delegates – all welcome!
