We use our funds to provide the buses so we can't afford to mount expensive advertising campaigns in the media, especially as our catchment area is so huge. This is where you come in! We'd love it if you could distribute a few timetables (or a lot!) to your neighbours, family, friends or work colleagues. Or you may know of a friendly shop, café or community centre which would display timetables. If you just need a handful, please pick them up from the info box on the bus. If you

need a larger quantity, please let us know either by e-mail or telephone. **Volunteer a little, or a lot** There are lots of other things you could do to help keep the buses on the road. How about becoming an 'Info Box Monitor'? As you'll know, we try and keep our box of information up-to-date on each bus. Maybe you could help by ensuring that they're full of useful information? And what about welcoming new passengers by pointing out *Moorsbuzz* and the Survey Forms? Sometimes passengers just need a little extra reassurance and maybe you're the person to do that. As someone recently wrote on a survey forms, we're the 'Friendly Bus.'

The Donate Ticket

Many passengers have said that they'd like to make some sort of contribution to Moorsbus. So this year, working with our partner bus companies, we've got a new way. On any journey you can ask the driver for a £1, £3 or £5 'Donate ticket.' The ticket is not valid for travel and the funds will go straight to the Moorsbus Community Interest Company bus fund. It's just another way you can keep YOUR bus service running. So if you've got some change in your pocket at the end of the day buy yourself an extra ticket.

WE'RE STILL BUSWALKING

As you'll know, Moorsbus pioneered the Buswalk and we're delighted that others are following in our footsteps. If you normally use a car, a Buswalk could transform your walking. You'll see so much more by replacing one leg of the walk with a short bus (or train) journey. Our website lists walks for Friday, Saturday and Sunday Moorsbuses, taking from an hour and a half to five hours. Join us on a Buswalk on 28 July from the Lion Inn on Blakey (details overleaf in 'What's On.')
