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WHEN?

Every Sunday & Bank Holiday in July, August & September 2022

HOW MUCH?

All-day Moors Rover ticket £9.50 (£2.50 for 5 to 17 year olds)

Family Moors Rover ticket £15 up to 2 adults + 4 children
(adult/s must be accompanied by at least 1 child)

Adult single fares available from just £1 (maximum single fare £5)

Young people (5 to 17) travel for £1 per journey

English National Concessionary Passes accepted

Contactless payment accepted

WHERE?

In towns, Moorsbuses use existing bus stops. In country areas give a clear signal to the driver to get on, and tell the driver where you'd like to get off.

All these Days Out ideas are based on leaving Yarm Town Hall at 09.09 on Moorsbus M5 (and returning at 18.44). The bus will pick up and set down at all normal bus stops in Yarm, coming in from Eaglescliffe and leaving towards Kirklevington.

Moors Tour: including breaks in Helmsley, Danby Lodge National Park Centre, Great Ayton and Stokesley.

Catch the 09.09 M5 to Stokesley and at 09.36 change on to the connecting M4 (departs at 09.39). The bus travels through Bilsdale, passing Rievaulx Abbey and arriving in Helmsley at 10.27. Enjoy a leisurely cup of coffee or a wander around the shops before departing on 128 at 11.30 to Kirkbymoorside (arrive 11.45) for the connection onto the 11.50 M3 to Danby (arrive 12.30). Café, toilets, shop, art gallery, exhibition, play areas, picnic sites, bird hide, walks and trails—free admission. Depart Danby at 14.00 on M3 arriving in Great Ayton at 14.43. Cafes, pubs, toilets, Captain Cook Schoolroom Museum. At 15.58 catch the M4 to Stokesley (cafes, shops, pubs, toilets). At 18.17 catch the M5 back to Yarm (arrive 18.44).

Thirsk, Byland Abbey and Coxwold

Catch the 09.09 M5 to Thirsk (arrive 10.39). Cafes, pubs, shops, toilets, information centre, World of James Herriot. Catch the M5 from Thirsk Market Place at 12.34 to Byland Abbey (arrive 12.53). Large ruins of Cistercian Abbey with impressive west front and remains of huge rose window. Once home to 100 monks and 200 lay brothers. Depart Byland at 14.50 on M5 to Coxwold (arrive 14.53). Church, Fauconberg Arms and Shandy Hall and gardens, once home to the eighteenth century writer Laurence Sterne. Catch the M5 at 16.53 for the journey from Coxwold to Yarm (via Thirsk and Northallerton) arriving at 18.44.

(For the return trip from Coxwold, you could get the 15.50 M5 to Helmsley (arrive 16.12), and then leave Helmsley at 17.27 on M4 to Stokesley via Bilsdale, arriving at 18.14, changing on to the M5 at 18.17 for the last leg of the journey back to Yarm (arrive 18.44).)

Helmsley and Pickering

Catch the 09.09 M5 to Stokesley (arrive 09.36) and change on to the connecting M4 at 09.39 from Stokesley to Helmsley (arrive 10.27). Cafes, toilets, shops. Get the 128 to Pickering at 11.30 (arrive Pickering 12.06). Castle, Beck Isle Museum, North Yorkshire Moors Railway, medieval wall paintings in parish church, shops, cafes, pubs, toilets. Depart Pickering on 128 at 15.45 for Helmsley (arrive 16.21). Catch the 16.31 M5 via Thirsk and Northallerton, arriving Yarm 18.44. Or catch the later M4 from Helmsley at 17.27, travelling via Bilsdale to Stokesley where you arrive at 18.14 and change onto the connecting M5 at 18.17 to Yarm (arrive 18.44).

walk & ride

There are lots of great walks from Moorsbus and our website lists many, including: Great Ayton to Stokesley; Lion Inn to Hutton le Hole; Dalby to Thornton le Dale; Blakey to Rosedale Abbey; etc.

Always plan your walk with care. Take appropriate food, drink and clothing, a timetable – and a good map.

Thornton le Dale

Catch the 09.09 M5 to Stokesley and at 09.36 change on to the connecting M4 for Helmsley (departs at 09.39). Arrive in Helmsley at 10.27. Cafes, pubs, shops, toilets. Depart Helmsley at 11.30 on 128 to Thornton le Dale (arrive 12.17). Pubs, tea rooms, souvenir shops, toilets and the car museum as featured in the TV series 'Bangers and Cash'. Interesting walks around the village with its thatched cottage and streamside properties. Depart Thornton le Dale on 128 at 15.34 to Helmsley (arrive 16.21). Catch the M4 from Helmsley to Stokesley (departs 17.27, arrives Stokesley 18.14) and change on to the connecting M5 to Yarm (departs Stokesley at 18.17, arrives Yarm 18.44).

Helmsley & Rievaulx Abbey

Catch the 09.09 M5 to Stokesley and at 09.36 change on to the connecting M4 for Helmsley (departs at 09.39). Arrive 10.17 at Rievaulx Abbey. Iconic ruins of Cistercian abbey in wonderful setting in the Rye Valley. Café, shop, museum, toilets. Catch the M4 at 13.32 for the 10 minute journey to Helmsley. Castle, walled garden, brewery, cafes, pubs, shops, toilets, Birds of Prey Centre. Then *either* (a) catch the M5 to Yarm via Thirsk and Northallerton (departs Helmsley 16.31, arrives Yarm 18.44) or (b) catch the M4 from Helmsley to Stokesley (departs 17.27, arrives Stokesley 18.14) and change on to the connecting M5 to Yarm (departs Stokesley at 18.17, arrives Yarm 18.44).

Hutton le Hole & Pickering

Catch the 09.09 M5 to Stokesley and at 09.36 change on to the connecting M4 for Helmsley (departs at 09.39). Arrive in Helmsley at 10.27. Cafes, pubs, toilets. Depart Helmsley at 11.30 on 128 to Kirkbymoorside (arrive 11.45). Catch the connecting M3 from Kirkbymoorside at 11.50 to Hutton le Hole (arrive 11.58). Tea rooms, toilets, shops, pub, Ryedale Folk Museum (over 20 reconstructed historic buildings on 6 acre site telling the story of the North York Moors from pre-historic days to the twentieth century), art gallery. Many short and longer walks (see our website for Walk & Ride) Catch M3 outside the museum at 13.47 to Pickering (arrive 14.10). Castle, museum, shops, pubs, cafes, toilets, steam railway. Leave Pickering on 128 at 15.41 to Helmsley (arrive 16.21). Then catch the M5 to Yarm via Thirsk (departs Helmsley 16.31, arrives Yarm 18.44).

Helmsley & Thirsk

Catch the M5 from Yarm at 09.09 and get off in Helmsley at 11.22. Cafes, pubs, toilets, shops, castle, walled garden, Birds of Prey Centre. Leave Helmsley at 14.31 on bus M5 to Thirsk (arriving 15.09). Shops, cafes, pubs, toilets, World of James Herriot. Leave Thirsk Market Place on M5 at 17.14 to Yarm arriving at 18.44.

Danby Lodge National Park Centre, Great Ayton and Stokesley

Catch the 09.09 M5 to Stokesley and at 09.36 change on to the connecting M4 for Helmsley (departs at 09.39). Arrive in Helmsley at 10.27. Cafes, pubs, toilets. Depart Helmsley at 11.30 on 128 to Kirkbymoorside (arrive 11.45). Catch the connecting M3 from Kirkbymoorside at 11.50 to Danby (arrive Danby 12.30). Explore the grounds and then enjoy the café, displays, art gallery, shop, toilets, picnic sites, play areas, bird hide, trails (free admission). Lots of short or longer walks. Get the 14.00 M3 to Guisborough, travelling on to Great Ayton (arrive 14.43). Cafes, pubs, toilets, Captain Cook Schoolroom Museum. Depart Great Ayton at 15.58 on M4 to Stokesley (arrive 16.06). Cafes, pubs, toilets. Catch the M5 in Stokesley for the homeward journey at 18.17, arriving in Yarm at 18.44.

Pickering and Helmsley

Catch the 09.09 M5 to Stokesley and at 09.36 change on to the connecting M4 for Helmsley (departs at 09.39). Arrive in Helmsley at 10.27. Cafes, pubs, toilets. Depart Helmsley at 11.30 on 128 to Pickering (arrive 12.06) Cafes, pubs, shops, toilets, castle, Beck Isle Museum, North Yorkshire Moors Steam Railway. Depart Pickering on 128 at 15.41 to Helmsley (arrive 16.21). Catch the M4 from Helmsley to Stokesley (departs 17.27, arrives Stokesley 18.14) and change on to the connecting M5 to Yarm (departs Stokesley at 18.17, arrives Yarm 18.44).

PAYING OUR WAY

Fares and pass reimbursement cover only part of the cost of running Moorsbus, so we rely on donations from passengers, parish councils, businesses and other groups.
